IMPORTANT HEALTH NOTICE: Our Diocese has directed parishes to **refrain** from the practice of intinction (**dipping the wafer into the wine**). For health reasons please co-operate with this requirement. Receiving the bread only is still regarded as a full expression of the sacrament, or you can simply hold or receive the chalice and then pass it back to the person serving. *Intinction is less hygienic than the common cup*

Letter of announcement to the Parish of the Cathedral of St John the Evangelist

Greetings to you all.

I am delighted to announce that I have made an appointment to a new role in the life of the Cathedral Parish of a Canon Precentor. The Canon Precentor will be a full-time clergy appointment that will contribute to the life of the Cathedral Parish and also in part support my role as Bishop on the Episcopal Ministry Team. As part of the redistribution of funding that was formerly used to support the Regional Deans the Standing Committee have been very supportive in response to my request to make an appointment of a Canon Precentor and have agreed to fund the full stipend including allowances. The Canon Precentor will have a variety of responsibilities in the life of the Cathedral parish and will be part of the ministry team in the Cathedral lead by the next Dean. The Canon Precentor will care for the parish congregation with a focus on pastoral care, preparation of liturgy and music, will participate in the Cathedral Chapter and have a significant role to support general parish life.

The Canon Precentor role will be an invaluable support to the next Dean and allow the Dean to focus on the Diocesan and Civic roles of the Cathedral as well as the significant projects that will arise in the Cathedral over the coming years.

I have pleasure in announcing that the priest who will be the Canon Precentor is the Rev'd Jenny Chalmers. Jenny is currently the Vicar of the Parish of Taupō and also the Vicar General of the Diocese. Jenny will continue to have a role as Vicar General and as part of that role will also participate in and assist me to lead the Episcopal Ministry Team for approximately one day per week.

Jenny will conclude her ministry in Taupō on Sunday 15 August and will commence here at the Cathedral on Sunday 5 September. Jenny is married to John and together they are looking forward to moving to Napier and hoping to be able to buy a home here soon.

Details of a suitable service to welcome Jenny and John to the Cathedral parish and install Jenny as Canon Precentor will be advised in the coming weeks.

I encourage you to pray for Jenny and John as they begin the transition to the Cathedral Parish.

On Sunday 18 July we will hold a consultation with the Cathedral Parish to help prepare for the appointment process. Please mark this date in your diary and come to the 10am service prepared to join the consultation meeting following morning tea at 11:15am and conclude by 1:00pm.

The Parish Consultation will ask 5 questions:

1. What are the present mission and ministry goals of the parish – both stated and un-stated? In other words, what is the parish “really about” at the moment?
2. What are the things you most value about your parish: the strengths of the parish?
3. What aspects of ministry in the parish need developing or strengthening further?
4. What dreams do you have for the future?
What are the key attributes / qualities that you seek in a new Dean?

The consultation meeting will also elect three members of the parish who are present at the meeting to join Alison as People's Warden on the Board of Nominations. There will be an opportunity to nominate people for election to those roles on the day of the meeting. Candidates must be present at the meeting to be eligible for election.



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
