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IMPORTANT HEALTH NOTICE: Our Diocese has directed parishes to **refrain** from the practice of intinction (**dipping the wafer into the wine**). For health reasons please co-operate with this requirement. Receiving the bread only is still regarded as a full expression of the sacrament, or you can simply hold or receive the chalice and then pass it back to the person serving. *Intinction is less hygienic than the common cup.*

We understand that it may be your preference to refrain from physical contact in these times.*

*During the next hymn the bread and wine, symbols of Christ's life,
are brought to the altar; donations to the Food Bank are presented, and our offerings of
money to support the mission and ministry of the Cathedral are collected,
along with pledges made via electronic banking.*

*The Choir sing the **Agnus Dei** whilst the communion assistants receive communion; then the Choir move to the altar rails to receive communion; then all are welcome to share the bread and wine of Christ's life, or to receive a blessing - please come to the altar rails via the centre aisle and return to your seats via the side aisles (or use the ramp if necessary and take a place at the rear altar rail).*

Christians of any tradition are welcome at our Lord's table. Communion in one kind (receiving the bread only) is considered a full expression of the Sacrament. If you prefer not to drink the wine, we invite you to receive, hold and acknowledge the Cup, and then pass it back to the person serving.

Please advise an usher if you need to have communion served in your seat, be assured we are pleased to assist you in this way.
