ANGLICAN DIOCESE OF WAIAPU SAFEGUARDING TRAINING

The Anglican Diocese of Waiapu is leading the way in safeguarding training with some new material prepared for this Diocese because it recognises the importance of ensuring safety for all who are involved in the church and all its activities.

Safeguarding is about protecting everyone involved in the Church – both those who minister (in any capacity) and those to whom they offer ministry. It is about understanding how our behaviours can impact on individuals, including those who have in the past been abused and are triggered by behaviours innocently practiced.

Although many will know of historical abuse in the past there is nothing that would indicate that this will not happen again in the future. It is all of our responsibility to ensure that everyone is safe who is involved in our Church.

Once this training is complete you will

- Understand safeguarding in a church context
- Be able to recognise the signs and indicators of abuse
- Understand the impacts of abuse on victims and others
- Recognise your own responsibilities to report abuse
- Know what actions to take if you witness abuse or someone tells you about abuse (Processes)
- Understand the boundaries of confidentiality
