Jesus said: There is joy among the angels of God over one sinner who repents.

God has promised forgiveness to all who truly repent, turn to Christ in faith and are themselves forgiving.

In silence we call to mind our sins.

Let us confess our sins.

Merciful God, we have sinned in what we have thought and said, in the wrong we have done and in the good we have not done. We have sinned in ignorance: we have sinned in weakness: we have sinned through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry. We repent and turn to you. Forgive us, for our Saviour Christ's sake, and renew our lives to the glory of your name. Amen.

Through the cross of Christ, God have mercy on you, pardon you and set you free. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. God strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal. **Amen.**

**The Baptism** \* the full liturgy begins on p384 of the Prayer Book \* those involved gather around the font, and the congregation turn to face the rear of the church.

Emily Charlotte is presented by her parents, Matthew and Joanna Gough to the Rev'd Raewyn Hedge.

The Baptismal liturgy continues, with the final question to the parents and godparents assuring us of their own faith:

Do you trust in Christ's victory which brings forgiveness, freedom and life?

They reply

In faith I turn to Christ, my way, my truth, my life, as I care for this child.

#### People

May God keep you in the way you have chosen!

#### The Baptism

The priest, parents, and godparents stand by the font Praise God who made heaven and earth, whose promise endures for ever. ... It is Christ who baptises with the Holy Spirit and with fire. Amen! Come Holy Spirit.

... Through your Holy Spirit fulfil once more your promises in this water of rebirth, set apart in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom, thanksgiving and honour, power and might, be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!

Emily is baptised with these words:

Emily I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

#### Amen.

God receives you by baptism into the Church. Child of God, blessed in the Spirit, welcome to the family of Christ.

We sign you with the cross, the sign of Christ.

A candle is presented with the following words:

Walk in the faith of Christ crucified and risen. Shine with the light of Christ.

#### The Affirmation

Praise to God who has given us life. Blessed be God for the gift of love.

Praise to God who forgives our sin. Blessed be God who sets us free.

Praise to God who kindles our faith. Blessed be God, our strength, our hope.

Let us, the baptised, affirm that we renounce evil and commit our lives to Christ.

Blessed be God, JESUS IS LORD! The parents and godparents are then asked to affirm their faith and assure us of how they will bring up their child – after which we are invited to pray:

God of love, we thank you for our calling to be disciples of Christ. Help us to nurture Emily in the faith we share. May she grow to love, worship and serve you, and bring life to the world. Amen.

#### The Celebration of Faith

Let us rejoice with those who have committed themselves to Christ, and celebrate the faith of our baptism.

Do you believe in God the Father?

# I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

#### The Peace

The presiding priest says to the people

The peace of Christ be always with you. **And also with you.** E te whānau, we are the body of Christ. **By one Spirit we were baptised into one body.** Keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. **Amen. We are bound by the love of Christ.** 

The people may exchange a sign of peace - and make their way back to their seats. Note hand sanitizer is available at the front of the aisle, which you may wish to use as you go forward for communion later in the service.

#### **Offertory Hymn**

 See what a morning, gloriously bright with the dawning of hope in Jerusalem; Folded, the grave-clothes, tomb filled with light, as the angels announce Christ is risen! See God's salvation plan, wrought in love, borne in pain, paid in sacrifice; Fulfilled in Christ, the Man, for He lives, Christ is risen from the dead!

2. See Mary weeping: 'Where is He laid? As in sorrow she turns from the empty tomb; Hears a voice speaking, calling her name: It's the Master, the Lord raised to life again! The voice that spans the years, speaking life, stirring hope, bringing peace to us; Will sound till He appears, for He lives, Christ is risen from the dead!

3. One with the Father, Ancient of Days, through the Spirit who clothes faith with certainty. Honour and blessing, glory and praise to the King crowned with power and authority! And we are raised with Him, death is dead, love has won Christ has conquered; And we shall reign with Him, for He lives, Christ is risen from the dead!

#### The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord is here. **God's Spirit is with us.**

in this sacrament of the suffering and death of your Son, we now celebrate the wonder of your grace and proclaim the mystery of our faith:

> Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come in glory.

Send your Holy Spirit

that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of your kingdom.

United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven,

we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing, honour and glory be yours, here and everywhere now and forever. Amen.

As Jesus taught us, we pray together in song

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.
