

Eucharistic Liturgy of New Fire and Renewal of Baptism



The Great Vigil of Easter 7.00 pm

Welcome to Waiapu Cathedral

This service brings us from the darkness of Good Friday to the joy of resurrection.

Our service follows on from the despair of Good Friday, where we gathered at the foot of the cross.

We hear the stories of Genesis and Exodus when God brought light out of darkness and led the people of Israel though the desert by fire.

We light the new fire of Easter and from there light the Paschal Candle. On the candle are painted the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, Alpha and Omega.

In Revelation 21:6 the exalted Christ says, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end."

There is a cross on the candle with "nails" that have incense in them.

We then process the candle into the Cathedral and light the candles inside.

The light heralds the resurrection of Christ.

We then renew our Baptismal vows in the tradition of the early church where the new converts, the catechumens, were baptised at dawn on Easter Day.

The paschal candle stays lit for all services during the fifty days of the Easter season, until the Day of Pentecost.

We use it then for baptisms and funerals as a link back to the Easter resurrection of our Lord.

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

We gather outside.

E te whanau a te Karaiti, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries, confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

Fellow pilgrims on the Christian way, let us now listen to the story of how God saved the people of Israel by mighty acts in their history, and in the fullness of time came among us in Christ Jesus as our Redeemer.

Reading: Genesis 1

Gracious and eternal God, you created all things with a marvellous beauty and order; help us now to recognise how still more wonderful is the new creation you have fashioned in the fullness of time by redeeming your people through Jesus Christ, the true Passover lamb, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Amen.

Reading: Exodus 14

God of steadfast love, by the power of your mighty arm you delivered your chosen people from slavery under Pharaoh, giving us a sign of salvation through the waters of baptism; grant that all the peoples of the earth may be numbered among the offspring of Abraham, and rejoice in the inheritance of your promises; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

We light the fire

Redeeming God, source of life and light, you made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light; bless this new fire, set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Paschal candle is marked and blessed

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. Amen.

The Paschal Candle is lit

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The Paschal candle is processed into the Cathedral, and stops at the Font.

Christ our light - Thanks be to God.

The presiding priest blesses the baptismal water in the font.

Reading: Ezekiel 37

> Living God, by the Passover of your Son you have brought us out of sin into righteousness, and out of death into life; grant to those who are sealed by your Holy Spirit the will and power to proclaim you to all the world: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

We move up the centre aisle and stop in the centre of the Nave

Christ our light - Thanks be to God

Psalm 114—said responsively:

- 1 When Israel came out of Egypt: the house of Jacob from among a people of an alien tongue,
- 2 Judah became the Lord's temple: and Israel became God's kingdom.
- 3 The sea fled at the sight of it: and Jordan turned back in its course.
- 4 The mountains skipped like rams: and the hills like yearling sheep.
- 5 Why was it that you fled O sea: and you Jordan that you turned back,
- 6 you mountains that you skipped like rams:

and you hills like yearling sheep?

- Tremble O earth at the presence of the Lord: at the presence of the God of Jacob.
- who turned the hard rock into a pool of water: and the flint-stone into a gushing spring.

The procession moves forward to the altar steps.

Christ our light - Thanks be to God

Moving to seats in the choir stalls, the **Exultet** (Proclamation of Easter) is sung:

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels!

O Universe, dance around God's throne!

Jesus Christ, our King, is risen!

Sound the victorious trumpet of salvation!

Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendour of your creation, radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King!

Christ has conquered! Now his life and glory fill you!

Darkness vanishes for ever!

Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory!

The risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you!

Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.

The Lord be with you and also with you

Lift up your hearts we lift them to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God It is right to give thanks and praise

It is right and good that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, Father almighty, the unseen God, through your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who has saved us by his death paid the price of Adam's sin and reconciled us once again to you.

Glory to you for ever.

For this is the Passover feast when Christ the true Lamb of God is slain whose blood consecrates the homes of all the faithful. Glory to you for ever.

This is the night when you first saved our ancestors, freeing Israel from her slavery, and leading her safely through the sea.

Glory to you for ever.

This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave. **Glory to you for ever.**

This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin, restored to grace and holiness, and share the victory of Christ. Glory to you for ever.

This is the night that gave us back what we had lost; beyond our deepest dreams you made even our sin a happy fault.

Glory to you for ever.

Most blessed of all nights, evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy.

Glory to you for ever.

Night truly blessed, when hatred is cast out peace and justice find a home, and heaven is joined to earth. and all creation reconciled to you.

Glory to you for ever.

Therefore, heavenly Father, in this our Easter joy accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Grant that this Easter candle may make our darkness light. Glory to you for ever.

For Christ the morning star has risen in glory. Christ is risen from the dead and his flame of love still burns within us! Christ sheds his peaceful light on the world! Christ lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Reading: Romans 6

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. Thanks be to God. Alleluia!

Collect for Easter Eve said together:

Eternal Giver of life and light, this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your Church with the Spirit given to us in baptism, that we may worship you in sincerity and truth, and shine as a light in the world; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever, Amen.

Gospel Reading for the day

All standing, the reader announces the **Gospel Praise and glory to God.**

After the Gospel reading:

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ, the Word.**

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Priest: We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water, your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting live.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection.

Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we celebrate our fellowship in him in faith.

We pray that all who have passed through the water of baptism may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life.

If there is a candidate for baptism, the promises are made now.

Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us renew the promises we made in baptism, when we rejected Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy catholic Church.

Praise to God who has given us life Blessed be God for the gift of love.

Praise to God who forgives our sin Blessed be God who sets us free.

Praise to God who kindles our faith **Blessed be God, our strength, our hope.**

Let us, the baptised, affirm that we renounce evil and commit our lives to Christ.

Blessed be God. JESUS IS LORD!

What is your faith?
I believe and trust in God the Father,
maker and sustainer of all things;
and in God the Son, my Saviour Jesus Christ;
and in God the Holy Spirit, giver of life and truth.
This is my faith.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
