- 1 Have mercy on me O God in your ' great ' kindness:  
**in the fulness of your mercy ' blot out ' my of'fences.**
- 2 Wash away ' all my ' guilt:  
**and ' cleanse me ' from my ' sin.**
- 3 For I ac'knowledge • my ' faults:  
**and my ' sin is ' always • be'fore me.**
- 4 Against you only have I sinned  
and done evil ' in your ' sight:  
**so that you are justified in your sentence,  
and ' blameless ' in your ' judging.**
- 5 Evil have I been ' from my ' birth:  
**sinner I am from the ' time of ' my con'ception.**
- 6 But you desire truth in our ' inward ' being:  
**therefore teach me wisdom ' in my ' secret ' heart.**
- 7 Take hyssop,  
sprinkle me with water and I ' shall be ' clean:  
**wash me, and I ' shall be ' whiter • than ' snow.**
- 8 Let me hear the sounds of ' joy and ' gladness:  
**that the bones you have ' broken ' may re'joice.**
- 9 Turn away your face ' from my ' sins:  
**and ' blot out ' all my • mis'deeds.**
- 10 Create in me a clean ' heart O ' God:  
**and re'new a • right ' spirit • with'in me.**
- 11 Do not cast me away ' from your ' presence:  
**do not take your ' holy ' spirit ' from me.**
- 12 Give me the joy of your ' help a'gain:  
**and strengthen me ' with a ' willing ' spirit.**
