## Psalm 86:1-10

1. Turn your ear to me O Lord and answer me: for I am poor and in misery.

- 2. Preserve my life for I am faithful: my God save your servant for I put my trust in you.
- 3. Be merciful to me O Lord: for I call to you all the day long.

- 4. Gladden the heart of your servant: for to you Lord I lift up my soul.
- 5. For you Lord are good and forgiving: and of great mercy to all who call upon you.
- 6. Give heed O Lord to my prayer: and listen to my cry of supplication.
- 7. In the day of my distress I will call: and surely you will answer me.
- 8. Among the gods there is none like you O Lord: nor can the deeds of any be compared with yours.
