Psalm 107:1–9, 43 (ANZPB-HKMoA)

- ¹ ‘O give thanks, for the Lord is gracious:
God’s steadfast love endures for ever.’
- ² So let the people say whom the Lord has redeemed:
whom the Lord has redeemed from the hand of the enemy,
- ³ and gathered out of the lands,
from the east and from the west:
from the north and from the south.

- ⁴ Some went astray in the desert wastes:
and found no way to a city where they could dwell.
- ⁵ They were hungry and thirsty:
and their soul was fainting within them.
- ⁶ Then they cried to you O Lord in their trouble:
and you rescued them from their distress.
