We remain standing for the bidding prayer:

Friends, at Christmas it is our joy to get ready to hear again the angels' message and, in our hearts, to go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, and the baby lying in the manger.

So tonight let us listen to the story told in the Bible – the story of God's love from the very beginning, through our failings, and into the hope and new life that came with this child. And let us fill this place with the sound of carols and songs of joy.

But first, let us pray. Let us pray for the needs of the world – for peace and goodwill everywhere, for unity among Christians, and especially for our own Diocese of Waiapu.

Let us remember those who need God's care in a special way: the poor and the powerless, the hungry and the oppressed; those who are sick in body or mind; those who grieve; the lonely and the unloved; the very old and the very young; and those who do not yet know Jesus or who have turned away from him.

And let us also remember those who have gone before us – those who now live in God's light and joy, whose hope was in Jesus, the Word made flesh, and who are still one with us in him.

We bring all these prayers and praises to God, using the words Jesus himself taught us:

Eighth Lesson *St Matthew 2: 1 – 12*

The wise men are led by the star to Jesus.

For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.'
