First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

Psalm 23 (ANZPB-HKMoA) –
at 10am the psalm is sung by the choir

¹The Lord is my shepherd:
therefore can I lack nothing.

²You Lord make me lie down in green pastures:
and lead me beside the waters of peace.

³You revive my spirit:
and guide me in right pathways
for your names sake.

⁴ Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,

A THOUGHT FROM TODAY'S SERMON

Entry into the sheepfold isn't about doing the right things in the right way – it's about recognising the shepherd's voice. That feeds into what we'll do later today, as we look at helping one another to be even more of a welcoming church – because hospitality isn't primarily about being impressive hosts (though we'd like to think that we are) but about making the shepherd's voice easier for people to hear. How easy is it for people to recognise that voice here, do you think? If someone were to come here for the first time, if someone were standing "at the gate" and dipping a toe into a service or one of our activities, what would they hear before anything else? ... Radical hospitality doesn't come from fancy programmes – it comes from a shared life, a life into which we want to welcome others. That welcome goes further than just making people feel comfortable – it's also about inviting them into meaningful participation, helping them find ways in which they too can be part of our shared life.
