First Reading: Acts 7:55–60

Psalm 31:1–6, 16–18 (*ANZPB-HKMoA*) –
at 10am the psalm is sung by the choir

1. In you Lord I have taken refuge:
let me never be put to shame,
2. deliver me in your righteousness:
incline your ear to me,
come quickly to my rescue.
3. Be to me a rock of refuge:
a stronghold to keep me safe.

4. You are to me a rock and a fortress:
for your names sake lead me and guide me.
5. Release me from the net they have secretly laid for me:
for you O Lord are my strength.
6. Into your hands I commend my spirit:
for you have redeemed me,
O Lord God of truth.
16. But my trust is in you O Lord:
I say, 'You are my God, my fortunes are in your hands.'
17. Deliver me from the power of my enemies:
and from the hand of those who persecute me.
