The Sermon

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the Easter mystery we have died and been buried with him in Baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life within the family of his Church. I invite us to renew the promises made at Baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ, and our rejection of all that is evil.

We turn to face the font.

Do you believe in God the Father?
**I believe in God the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.**

**On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

Those who are baptised are called to worship and serve God. From the beginning, believers have continued in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

Will you commit yourself to this life?

I will, with God's help.

Will you forgive others as you are forgiven?

I will, with God's help.

Will you seek to love your neighbour as yourself,
and strive for peace and justice?

I will, with God's help.

Will you accept the cost of following Jesus Christ
in your daily life and work?

I will, with God's help.

With the whole Church will you proclaim by word and action
the Good News of God in Christ?

I will, with God's help.

Praise God who made heaven and earth,
whose promise endures for ever.

We thank you God for your love in all creation,
especially for your gift of water
to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.
We thank you that through the waters of baptism
you cleanse us, renew us by your Spirit
and raise us to new life.
In the new covenant we are made members of your Church
and share in your eternal kingdom.
Therefore, in joyful obedience to Christ,
we celebrate our fellowship in him through faith.
We pray that all who pass through the waters of baptism
may continue for ever in the risen life
of Jesus Christ our Saviour.
**Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom,
thanksgiving and honour, power and might,
be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!**

*As we sing the following hymn the priest sprinkles us with the
baptismal waters.*

**Christ is alive, and the universe must celebrate,
and the stars and the suns shout on this Easter Day!
Christ is alive, and his family must celebrate
in a great alleluia, a great alleluia
to praise the power that made the stone roll away.**

**Here is our hope: in the mystery of suffering
is the heartbeat of Love, Love that will not let go,

and we sing alleluia, we sing alleluia
to praise the power that made the stone roll away.**

We remain standing, though feel free to sit if needs be.

we worship you, O God,
in songs of everlasting praise.

here and everywhere
now and forever. Amen.**

The Communion

The risen Christ is in our midst, and so we pray, singing

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.**

Give us today our daily bread.

**Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.**

**Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.**

**For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours
now and for ever. Amen.**

The priest breaks the bread in silence

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

**We who are many are one body,
for we all share the one bread.**

Come God's people;
come to receive Christ's heavenly food.

The priest and people receive communion

All who are baptised are welcome to receive communion.

- ***Prayer ministry** is available in the Resurrection Chapel during the communion time.*
- ***Communion is offered in both kinds** (bread and wine) though feel free to receive only the bread.*
- ***We do not, for health reasons,** dip the bread in the wine. This makes it safer for us all.*
- ***Gluten free wafers** are available from the person administering the bread.*
