First Reading: Genesis 21:8–21

Psalm 86:1–10, 16–17 (ANZPB-HKMoA) –

at 10am the psalm is sung by the choir

¹Turn your ear to me O Lord and answer me:
for I am poor and in misery.

²Preserve my life for I am faithful:
my God save your servant for I put my trust in you.

³Be merciful to me O Lord:
for I call to you all the day long.

⁴Gladden the heart of your servant:
for to you Lord I lift up my soul.

⁵For you Lord are good and forgiving:
and of great mercy to all who call upon you.

⁶Give heed O Lord to my prayer:
and listen to my cry of supplication.

⁷In the day of my distress I will call:
and surely you will answer me.
