SOME THOUGHTS ABOUT OUR LITURGIES

Why do we read from the Bible in Eucharistic worship?

Just as we break bread together so we break open The Word. Christ the Logos is the Word of God. One of the ways we encounter God is through reading aloud and reflecting on sacred scripture. Jesus himself read aloud when he gathered with others in the synagogue.

What role do the psalms play in Eucharistic worship?

Anglicans are encouraged to read aloud or sing the psalms, as part of the Eucharist and daily prayer. The psalms are the prayers of the ancient people of God and using them honours our relationship to our whakapapa. In the Eucharist the psalm functions as a response to the first reading.
