SOME THOUGHTS ABOUT OUR SERVICES

The Liturgies of the Eucharist in *A New Zealand Prayer Book / He Karakia Mihinare o Aotearoa* are divided into two sections: The Ministry of the Word, followed by The Ministry of the Sacrament. The Ministry of the Word begins with The Gathering of the Community.

Why do we give space for 'The Gathering of the Community'?

When we visit friends or family, the first part of the visit involves arriving, connecting with each other, and catching up with how people are. Each group of friends, or family, or community, may have different ways of doing this - a ritual that has evolved - but there is usually an accepted pattern for this. The gathering turns us from our individual lives towards God and towards one another. It allows us to lay our burdens and our joys before God so that we can act together as one. These words are a communal way to state why we have gathered, and who and Whose we are.
