First Reading: Exodus 3:1–15

at 10am the psalm is sung by the choir

¹Give thanks and call upon the name of the Lord:

 tell of all the wonderful deeds of the Most High.
³Exult in God's holy name:
 let the heart of those who seek the Lord rejoice.
⁴Turn for help to the Lord your strength:
 and constantly seek God's presence.
